BANKING ARRANGEMENTS

Cllr. Smith confirmed the Council's banking arrangements – making the following comments: No interest had been paid on the £23K held in the Barclays Account. He is actively pursuing this subject and will report back to the full Council. He will also be writing to all Banks and Building Societies, where the Council hold accounts, and Zurich Insurance to inform them of the change in Responsible Financial Officer. Bank Mandates will also require changing and this will be carried out after the Co-option issue has been decided.

1822

TO RECEIVE AND REVIEW THE INTERNAL AUDITED ACCOUNTS FOR THE FINANCIAL YEAR 2009/2010 PREPARED BY DAVID VAUGHAN ACCOUNTANTS, IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE TOWN COUNCIL'S RESPONSIBLE FINANCIAL OFFICER.

The internal audited accounts had previously been circulated to Councillors. The Responsible Financial Officer, Cllr. Smith, asked if there were any questions. The ATT explained that this item would stand adjourned to be agreed at the next Meeting of the full Council (June).

Cllr. Kennedy proposed that Standing Orders be suspended. This was seconded by Cllr. Squire and unanimously agreed. (Vote 10 For. 0 Against. 0 Abstentions).

COUNTY COUNCILLOR'S REPORT

Cllr. Parsons said he wished to express a huge thank you to Cllrs. Squire and Buckingham for the fantastic job they had done in their year in office; "it is very much appreciated". He also thanked the whole Council for welcoming him into his role as County Councillor. Cllr. Parsons briefly covered several subjects; DCC and the work being undertaken to try and turn around the financial situation it has been experiencing; Catesby – awaiting the outcome of the Appeal and S106's being under severe scrutiny; the outcome of the General Election as regards the Unitary situation; the Agri-business proposals and the work to be achieved to gain financial support for Northern Devon. There was a brief discussion on the infrastructure of Holsworthy surrounding school placements and Cllr. Parsons reiterated his comments of last month – he is actively investigating how DCC arrive at its figures.

Cllr. Parsons returned briefly to the subject of drugs within Holsworthy and commended the Police for the work he knows they are carrying out with regard to this subject.

Cllr. Heslip queried the way in which DCC deal with transport charges to pupils that have to attend schools/colleges outside Holsworthy. Cllr. Parsons will look into this. Cllr. Jose asked Cllr. Parsons if he knew who was responsible for carrying out recent traffic surveys within Holsworthy. Cllr. Parsons said he wasn't aware that the survey, for which money had been provided, had been carried out and he would investigate this.

Cllr. Latty proposed the Meeting return to Standing Orders. This was seconded by Cllr. Squire and unanimously agreed. (Vote 10 For. 0 Against. 0 Abstentions).

ACTING TOWN CLERK'S REPORT

The ATC reported as follows:

- The Parks' Committee Minutes showed that representatives of the Cricket Club be invited to a meeting of the Committee. The ATC asked for clarification as to whom the invite should be addressed. Cllr. Heslip said he was due to take over the role of Secretary to Holsworthy Football Club and therefore correspondence could be sent to him.
